Dr. Md. Abdullah Al Mashrur is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics at East West University, Dhaka, Bangladesh. He earned his Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Houston, USA, in 2023 and joined East West University the same year. Before that, he completed an M.Sc. in Economics at Auburn University, USA, and MSS and BSS degrees in Economics at the University of Dhaka. His research is primarily in development economics, with specific interests in colonialism in the Indian subcontinent, labor markets in Bangladesh, climate change, refugees, and cities. With his coauthors, he is currently studying refugee burden, enclaves, and the dynamics of protests.

Dr. Shaikh Tanvir Hossain is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics and Social Sciences (ESS) at BRAC University, Dhaka, Bangladesh. He completed his doctoral studies at the Faculty of Business and Economics, TU Dortmund University, Germany, under the supervision of Prof. Carsten Jentsch, and passed his defense magna cum laude with a dissertation on parametric and nonparametric learners for adaptive experiments under interference. He earned an M.Sc. in Economics from the University of Mannheim, Germany, and a B.B.A. from BRAC University with a second major in Economics, graduating with distinction. He worked as a research associate at the University of Mannheim and TU Dortmund University, and before that as a Project Assistant (Data Management) at Innovations for Poverty Action (IPA) Bangladesh, where he managed survey and factory data for a study of supervisor training in the Bangladeshi garment sector. From 2022 to 2025, he taught undergraduate statistics and mathematics in the Department of Economics at East West University, first as an adjunct and later as a full-time Lecturer. His research lies at the intersection of econometrics, causal inference, and machine learning. He is also a postdoctoral scholar at the Geldsetzer Lab, Stanford University, where he applies causal inference and econometric methods to dementia research.
